PETER GREEN IS reportedly "most annoyed" over current rumors that he "dropped" Stone The Great at Lincoln. According to the Fleetwood Manager Clifford Davies, Green, although rehearsing with Crowe, was not asked to play at Lincoln and reports that he abandoned the gig at the last minute.

Stone The Great appeared at the Great Western Festival with guitarist Steve Howe from Yes. They have since found a permanent replacement for Cat Harvey in Jimmy McCulloch, who joined Crowe last week.

Green's version of the story is that a friend called him up, told him of Crowe's difficulties and asked him to help out on a temporary basis. He did some rehearsals and then said "no" when asked to play the Berkeley Festival. He claims that Stone the Great "took it for granted" that he would join the band.

Davies also said "If and when Peter Green decides to play again the story will come from me." Green, added Davies, did not even possess a guitar, and had no intentions of playing at all for anyone.

t. rex — all tours end

WITH T. REX fan fever reaching unprecedented heights, Marc Bolan said this week he may be forced to give up gigs in Britain after one more "farewell" tour of the country.

Speaking after hysterical scenes during Rex's concert in Manchester, Bolan said that weather difficulties were making it "almost impossible" to tour.

He added, "One more tour, I should think, and that will be the last. It becomes impossible to handle at a certain point."

During the sell-out show — for which tickets had sold within 20 minutes of opening the box office — one fan suffered a broken jaw and dozens of seats were damaged in the crush to reach the stage front.

Eye witnesses said many were "smashed to pieces," and a spokesman for the T. Rex office said that after the show the theatre resembled a battleground.

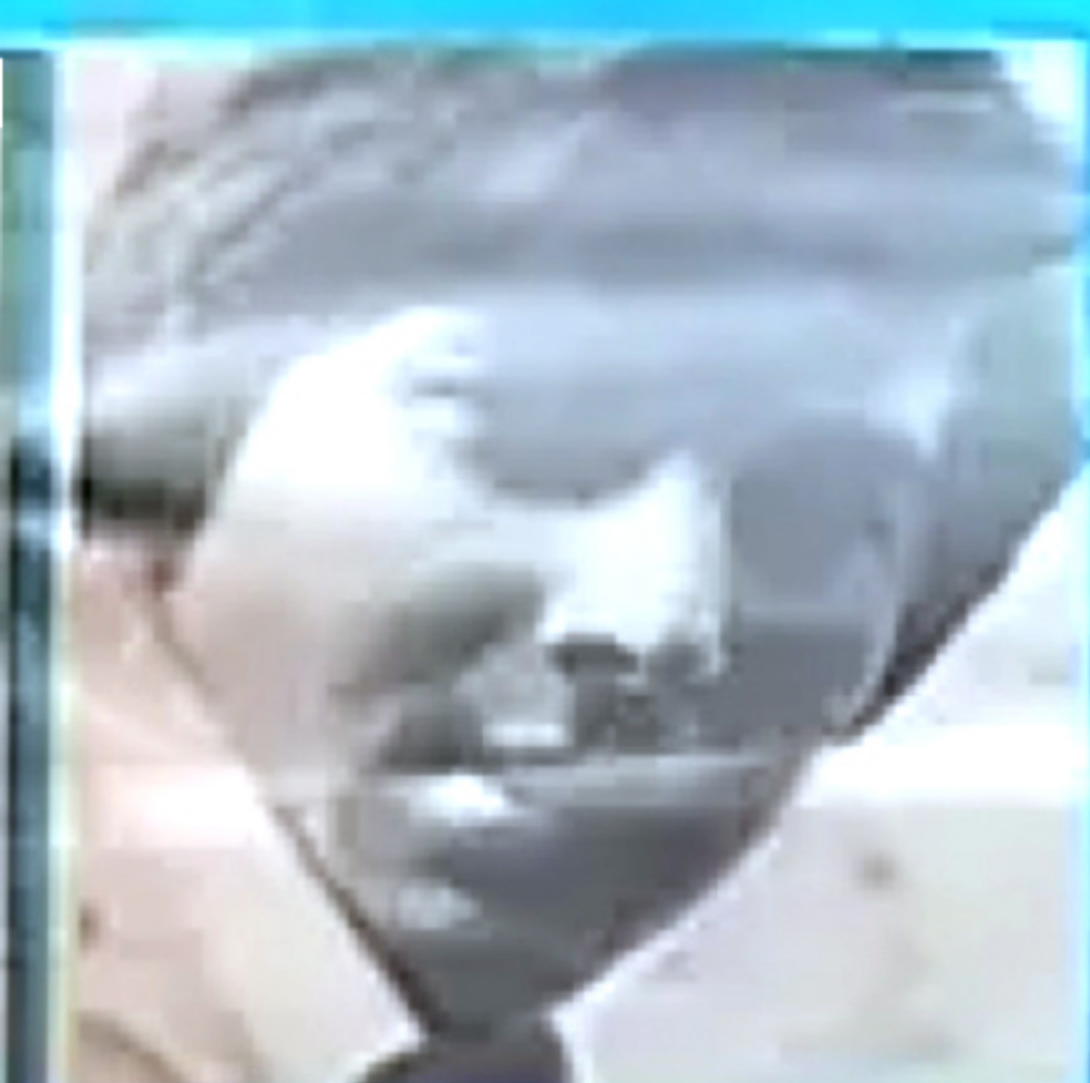
Pressure from fans is also causing Bolan to "become a recluse".

david cassidy expounds

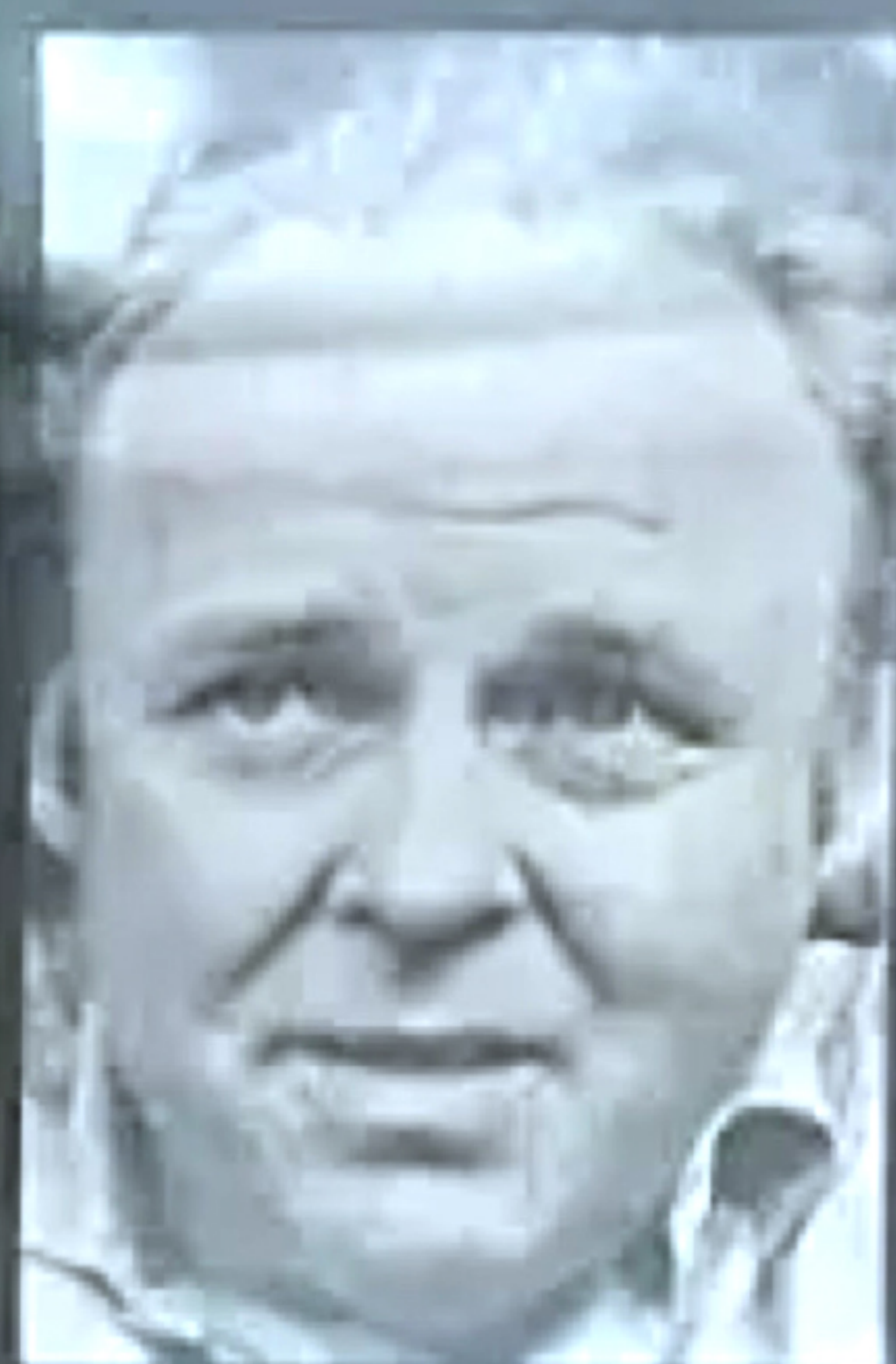
