# DAVID CASSIDY . . . ROCK ME. BABY

This album is definitely the best musical thing that's happened to David Cassidy fans! We all know that David has incredible talent, but so far it's been difficult to persuade non-fans to believe it. Like elder brother Donny, Jimmy has achieved an album full of tracks, every one of which could be released as a single and probably zoom straight to Number One!
