'PARTRIDGE FAMILY'

TV series shot on campus

Shirley Jones and 149 other cast and crew members from Screen Gems Productions came to USC Wednesday to film a segment for "The Partridge Family" television series.

One scene for the segment,

entitled "The Undergraduate," was shot around the fountain in Alumni Park, ironically where a scene from the movie "The Graduate" was filmed several years ago. The crew also used University Ave., the Sidewalk Cafe and the Von KleinSmid Center.

Miss Jones' television children, including David Cassidy, were not present, much to the disappointment of many preteens wandering around the campus.

The cast and crew, with several large trucks, rolled in about 7 a.m. and set up at the Sidewalk Cafe. Miss Jones appeared here in conversation while sitting at a table. Later the crew moved to the Doheny

fountain for a shot of Miss Jones walking across Alumni Park and speaking to a professor.

From there the crew progressed to the Von KleinSmid

Center, where Miss Jones was photographed leaving a class and speaking to a fellow student.

In gratitude for the use of the campus, Screen Gems donated \$1,000 to USC and agreed to a university policy of not photographing Tommy Trojan or any signs that would identify the campus as USC.

The shooting marked the second time "The Partridge Family" has used USC for a location and the thirteenth time since 1968 that camera crews have used the campus.
