CHARLOTTE — Add to the list of bobby-soxer and teenybopper idols the name of David Cassidy, who is scheduled to appear at Charlotte Coliseum April 30 at 4 p.m.

Cassidy, 5 feet 8, 130 pounds, choirboy face, brown hair and hazel eyes is the latest in the line who have throbbed out songs that unnerve the female adolescents of the country.

Preceeding him were such singers as Elvis Presley, Bobby Rydell and Ricky Nelson. And from an earlier era there was Frank Sinatra and even Rudy Vallee.

The newest idol, who records for Bell Records, is credited with 98 per cent of the sales of Partridge Family singles and albums. Tabbed the hottest attraction in show business, he appears to sell out crowds no matter where he goes.

Despite the fact that his father is the famous Jack Cassidy and his stepmother is the lovely Acadamy Award winner Shirley Jones, David has achieved his place strictly on his own. He does co-star
