

David Cassidy cancels Dec. 29 show

MANTOWOC — The Dec. 29 David Cassidy performance at the Capitol Civic Centre has been canceled by Cassidy's management, according to a news release from Lori Kirby, the Capitol's marketing director.



This is David Cassidy the second cancellation for Cassidy, who was originally scheduled to perform on Sept. 29.

"We are very disappointed with this development. David remains a popular draw and a great

talent, but the decision to cancel this booking after rescheduling leaves a bad taste in our mouths," said Matt Schliesman, executive director, in the release.

"Through the Baileigh Industrial Marquee Series we strive to bring an exciting variety of world-class performers to our community. David Cassidy filled this profile. But the David Cassidy story is not ending well for us. Not only does this double cancellation stress our relationships with patrons, advertisers, and sponsors, but this will hurt us financially, too, through the loss of anticipated revenues and the costs of marketing the show twice," Schliesman

said.

"We are starting the process of refunding all tickets purchased for the show. The box office will be in touch with each customer over the next week or so. On behalf of the Capitol staff and board of directors, we offer our regrets over how this much anticipated event has turned out. This is not common. May it not happen again," he said.

Customers may receive a full refund, a credit of their purchase toward any other show coming up at the Capitol this season or the opportunity to make a tax-deductible gift of the ticket purchase to the Capitol, which is a 501c3 charitable organization. A receipt will be provided.
