1923

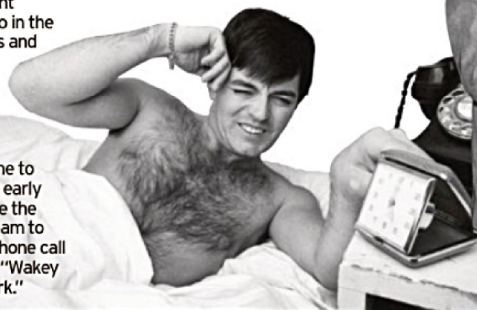

He once said: "I've just taught thousands of people over the radio in the USA how to mend broken watches and broken house appliances."

1967

DJ Tony Blackburn was had no time to waste when it came to making his early morning BBC Radio One show. The 22-year-old had his alarm set to 5am to wake up him and he would get a phone call from the production team saying: "Wakey wakey Tony love, time to go to work."



1980
